“Carrying One Another”

Last week we began the fast. This week we learn how to walk it.

The healing of the paralytic teaches us that salvation is not isolated. We rise together.

The man was lowered down by four faithful friends. Before his body was healed, his sins were forgiven. Christ heals the soul first, then the body follows.

Reflection for this week:

- Is there someone who needs me to carry them in prayer?
- Am I humble enough to let others carry me when I am weak?
- What spiritual paralysis do I need Christ to forgive first?

Practice for the week:

1. Pray daily for one specific person by name.
2. Fast not only from food, but from criticism.
3. Make one deliberate act of encouragement.

Lent is not about perfection. It is about perseverance.

Pascha is coming, but we walk there together.

Second Sunday of Great Lent -Commemoration of Gregory Palamas, Archbishop of Thessalonica
Theophylact the Confessor, Bishop of Nicomedia; Apostle Hermas of the Seventy

·During the Little Entrance, chant the Resurrectional Apolytikion. The Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) is “O come, let us worship... save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead...” After the Little Entrance, chant these hymns in the following order:

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION - TONE SIX

When Mary stood at Thy grave, looking for Thy sacred body, angelic powers shone above Thy revered tomb; and the soldiers who were to keep guard became as dead men. Thou led Hades captive and wast not tempted thereby. Thou didst meet the Virgin and didst give life to the world, O Thou, Who art risen from the dead, O Lord, glory to Thee.

POLYTIKION OF ST. GEORGE - TONE FOUR

As deliverer of captives and defender of the poor, healer of the infirm, champion of kings, victorious Great Martyr George intercede with Christ our God to save our souls.

KONTAKION FOR SUNDAYS IN GREAT LENT (AND AKATHIST SATURDAY) - TONE EIGHT

To thee, the Champion Leader, do I offer thanks of victory, O Theotokos, thou who hast delivered me from terror; but as thou that hast that power invincible, O Theotokos, thou alone can set me free: from all forms of danger free me and deliver me, that I may cry unto thee: Hail, O Bride without Bridegroom.

THE EPISTLE

O Lord, save Thy people, and bless Thine inheritance.
Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord my God.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (1:10-2:3)

Thou, “O Lord, in the beginning didst lay the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the works of Thy hands; they will perish; but Thou remainest; and they will all grow old like a garment, and like a mantle Thou wilt roll them up, and they shall be changed; but Thou art the same, and Thy years will not fail.” But to which of the angels did He say at any time, “Sit on My right hand, until I make thine enemies a footstool for thy feet?” Are they not all spirits for liturgical ministry, sent forth to minister for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation? Therefore, we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things that were heard, lest at any time we drift away from them. For if the word spoken through angels was confirmed, and every transgression and disobedience received a just retribution, how shall we escape, if we neglect so great a salvation, which having at first been spoken through the Lord, was confirmed to us by those who heard?

THE GOSPEL

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark. (2:1-12)

At that time, when Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that He was at home. And many were gathered together, so that there was no longer room for them, not even about the door; and He was preaching the Word to them. And they came, bringing to Jesus a paralytic carried by four men. And when they could not get near Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above Him; and when they had made an opening, they let down the pallet on which the paralytic lay. And when Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, “Son, your sins are forgiven.” Now, some of the scribes were sitting there, reasoning in their hearts, “Why does this man speak thus? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?” And immediately Jesus, perceiving in His spirit that they thus reasoned within themselves, said to them, “Why do you reason thus in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, ‘Your sins are forgiven,’ or to say, ‘Rise, take up your pallet and walk’? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins” – He said to the paralytic – “I say to you, rise, take up your pallet and go home.” And he rose, and immediately took up the pallet and went out before them all. So that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, “We never saw anything like this!”

Second Sunday of Lent - Mark 2:1-12
“Break Through the Roof”

In this Sunday’s Gospel, four friends carry a paralyzed man to Christ. The house is full. The door is blocked. There is no space left.

Most people would have gone home.

But not them.

- They climb the roof.
- They dig through it.
- They lower their friend down, directly in front of Jesus.

And the Gospel says something extraordinary:

“When Jesus saw their faith...” (Mark 2:5)

Not just his faith.

Their faith.

Great Lent is not a private journey. We carry one another.

Some of us are the paralytic; tired, burdened, spiritually numb.

Some of us are the four friends, called to lift, carry, pray, and refuse to give up on someone.

- Break through whatever roof is blocking you.
- Do not go home without Christ.

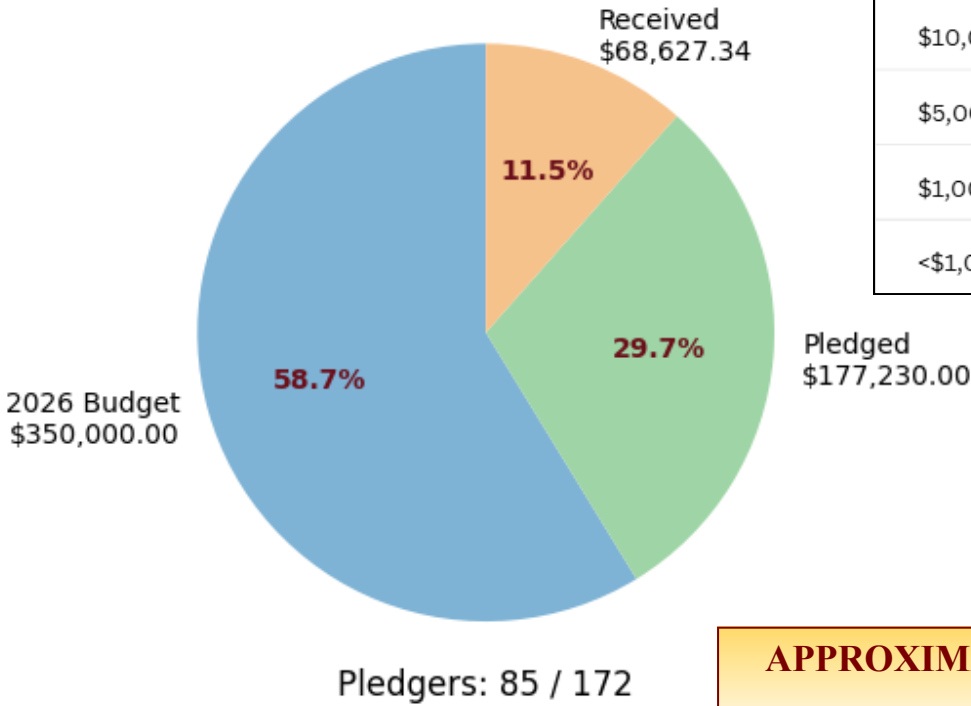

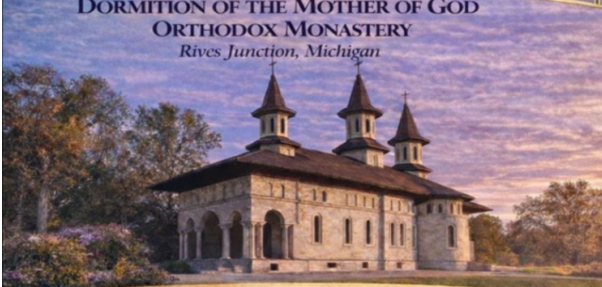

The application for the **Francis Maria Scholarship for 2026** is now available on the archdiocese website bit.ly/MariaScholarship2026. This scholarship is designed for young adults in good standing in the Antiochian Orthodox Archdiocese of North America. Eligible applicants must be U.S. or Canadian citizens or permanent residents who are entering any of the first four years of an accredited **undergraduate** college. The scholarship offers a \$10,000 award to assist with the rising costs of tuition, aiming to encourage more Orthodox young adults to pursue higher education and become informed leaders in the Orthodox Christian community. Please share this information with your college-aged young adult leaders, and the need for timely submission emphasizing the earlier deadline. The scholarship prioritizes those who are actively involved in their communities, hold leadership positions within their parish, diocese, or archdiocese.

In addition, the **Maria Meritorious Scholarship for 2026** is now accepting applications. This scholarship offers a \$2,000 award to support service-oriented young adults facing financial difficulties. It is open to both **undergraduate and graduate** students who are actively involved in their parish and can demonstrate a need for financial assistance.
